Hi Scott, thanks so much for the information. I had not talked to the owner of the boarding facility, just the workers caring for Zoe, who did not seem to be aware of the diarrhea situation with other dogs. I was told that random screening fecals were run on a random dog every week and that Zoe had been the randomly selected dog. I did check with Giana (Zoe's owner) to ask if she could recall signing any documentation about testing of samples prior to consultation with her and she could not recall that, but of course I'm sure there could have been a well worded document signed months in the past that she does not remember the exact details of. I am wondering whether I should report the clinic that did the testing, but unfortunately they did not document the "loaded with cystine crystals" statement on their record, the only thing written was that the stool was coccidia positive and an exam and urinalysis were recommended. I wish I had the "loaded with cystine crystals" statement caught on tape, but sadly we don't record phone conversations and it was only said via phone to my tech, so I don't know if there is really enough proof of poor veterinary medicine to even attempt to contact the board. Thanks for your help, hope it didn't put you out too much!

Hi Doc,

Thank you for faxing over the record on Zoe Perdikakis. Just to give an update, I reached out to Jeff Gellman who owns Solid K9 regarding whether he or someone at the kennel did the original fecal and why a fecal was run if they didn't do it, but rather submitted it to a vet to be run. The story that we got (I didn't speak with him, I was on a conference call when he called back, but he spoke with Dr Belinsky here) is that the kennel did not perform the fecal exam but rather took a sample to Titan for them to run the test. The reason that the test was run was that other dogs that were housed with Zoe had diarrhea and Gellman said he submitted fecals on all dogs once this was noted. Gellman also told Dr Belinsky that he has all dog owners sign a release that authorizes him to seek appropriate veterinary care if an animal is sick.

Bottom line is that it doesn't appear that there is any evidence that Gellman is trying to diagnose a condition. It appears that he has substantively met the burden of a veterinary client patient relationship by acting as the owner appointed guardian as established by the owner authorizing him to seek care (I didn't ask for him to provide a copy of that document. I will probably talk to Zoe's owner before doing that to ask if she acknowledged signing such a document.) So, I don't think Jeff did anything criminal as far as I can see. I do agree with you that if a medical condition arose the dog's usual vet should be sought since you know the dog best. I also think that as a matter of operation that it would also be best if the owner authorized lab submissions or treatment unless it was an emergency and the owner could not be reached. However, as I said, it would be hard to make a case that he committed any crime when his defense will be that he was concerned about the dog in his care being sick so he submitted a fecal exam to a vet for analysis, and when the vet found parasites, he scheduled the dog to be treated. That would arguably show that he is very proactive if anything.

I guess the other issue would be the competency of the vet that ran the fecal to properly diagnose hookworms and the finding of cysteine in the feces. If you think the vet acted incompetently then I think a complaint to the Veterinary Board of Licensure would be in order. Please let me know if I am missing an element of this case that you think might change my way of thinking about it. I shared your concern that based on our original info it appeared that the kennel ran the fecal, but now that this appears to not be the case the actions Gellman took don't appear to be criminal.

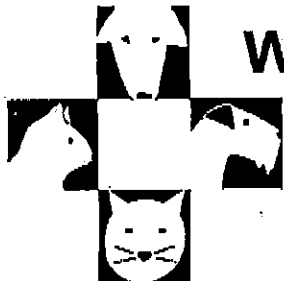

Relayed to him that I am concerned about the validity of the fecal testing performed b/c cystine crystals are not something that is found in fecal samples and does not necessitate urine testing. Walked Zoe outside for 10 minutes and unable to obtain a fecal sample from her, so collected as much as possible from digital rectal exam; will submit for Fecal OP to lab; if not enough sample we will call and have the kennel collect a larger fresh sample and bring back, but do not want to treat patient for anything until I have those results back. Because I do not have permission from Giana to discuss Zoe's medical record, I cannot specifically discuss any of Zoe's medical issues; however, Giana has all routine and elective blood, urine, and fecal screening performed on Zoe. If Zoe does need treatment I will call Giana's sister, Rhea, and have her pick up medications to be dispensed by the kennel while Giana is on vacation. Gave Cameron a handout on Coccidia so that they would know what it was; discussed that healthy adult dogs rarely get Coccidia, but that if in the environment she could have picked it up. Did recommend that kennel make sure that all puppies that are enrolled have at least 2 negative fecal tests with DVM 3-4 weeks apart before they are considered "parasite free" and that healthy adult dogs get tested 1-2x yearly. Solid Training paid for bill today.

Told owner not to worry about crystals right now as I have a recent UA sample run here from 8/14 which shows NSF and that depending on how urine sample was collected and run those crystals could be artifact or amorphous debris only. As long as Zoe is not showing signs of lower urinary tract disease we will not worry about the urine crystals for now; can check a fresh sample here when owner back from vacation as long as patient asymptomatic. Surprised if Zoe has hookworms b/c she receives Heartgard Plus monthly (owner last gave 3 days ago = Sunday) and patient had a negative fecal 8/2014 as well. Before we worry about these things requested that owner call the kennel and authorize records be released to WSAC so that we can figure out what is going on and worry about deworming or rechecking urine samples. Good news is that the kennel said that Zoe's skin is looking better today on the antibiotics. 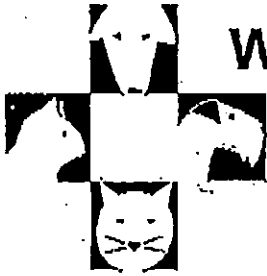

Cefpodoxime 100mg

Give 1.5 tablets orally once daily starting on Monday if no improvement in Zoe's skin condition. Once this medication is started it should be continued for the full 22 day course and Zoe's skin should be re-examined 14-18 days after starting it. Give with food to avoid stomach upset.

Pyoben Shampoo 8oz

Use to bathe Zoe today and Sunday. If no improvement in skin condition start the antibiotic dispensed; if improvement in skin condition, continue to bathe every 3rd day for 2 weeks.

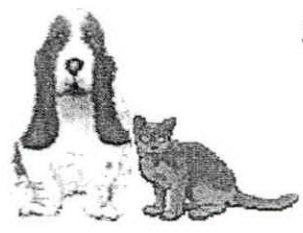
Give 1.5 tablets orally once daily starting on Monday if no improvement in Zoe's skin condition. Once this medication is started it should be continued for the full 22 day course and Zoe's skin should be re-examined 14-18 days after starting it. Give with food to avoid stomach upset.

Pyoben Shampoo 8oz

Use to bathe Zoe today and Sunday. If no improvement in skin condition start the antibiotic dispensed; if improvement in skin condition, continue to bathe every 3rd day for 2 weeks.
