ATTENDING VETERINARIAN AND ADEQUATE VETERINARY CARE (DEALERS AND EXHIBITORS).

A 5 year old white dwarf male rabbit was observed in a cage with hair loss and wounds on the left flank and hair loss on the right flank. The ear margins were white and crusty. The right eye lid was red, draining, and swollen shut. The rabbit was trembling in the cage despite the ambient temperature in the shed of 80 degrees. The feeder was overflowing with food with no evidence that the rabbit had eaten any. The rabbit had been placed with a new cage mate on May 30th but was separated the morning of May 31st and treated with a topical ointment.

Injured or ill animals must receive appropriate veterinary care to prevent, control, diagnose and treat diseases and injuries to prevent pain and suffering.

Upon request, the veterinarian was immediately contacted and an appointment made for the rabbit to be seen. The rabbit was brought inside and offered fresh vegetables which he ate.

FACILITIES, GENERAL.

The one year old female dromedary camel "Kaytee" was found dead on Wed, April 11th during the morning feeding. Her head and neck was wrapped around a fence pole into the adjoining paddock and her feet and legs were tangled in the fence rails. She had been normal the previous day. No necropsy was performed.

Juvenile camels have been moved to a different enclosure and the camel fences have been replaced to prevent re-occurrence by the time of inspection.

All enclosures or facilities for all the animals must be constructed of such material and of such strength as appropriate for the animals involved. All facilities must be structurally sound, free from sharp, protruding points or edges, and must be maintained in good repair to protect the animals from injury and to properly contain them. A system of timely identification, maintenance, and repair of facilities must be in place to ensure the health and
