ATTENDING VETERINARIAN AND ADEQUATE VETERINARY CARE (DEALERS AND EXHIBITORS).

Two fallow deer were observed with extremely long hooves on all four legs. One adult brown La Mancha goat had overgrown and misshapen hooves on both rear legs. Overgrown hooves can lead to pain, discomfort, lameness, gait abnormalities and joint/conformation problems. Veterinarian needs to evaluate and trim hooves for the deer and the La Mancha goat by 7/25/17.

Excessive numbers of horn flies were observed on the cattle. Cattle were exhibiting signs of irritation by stomping, twitching and excessive tail swishing. The painful bites can lead to skin lesions, infections and disease transmission. An effective fly control program can lead to reduction of fly numbers and irritation and pain for the animals. Animals treated during the inspection.

FACILITIES, GENERAL.

In the rabbit area, an open bag of rabbit food was sitting on the ground. Open bags and bags stored on the ground are susceptible to infestation of vermin and pests resulting in contaminated food supplies which could reduce the wholesomeness or palatability of the food. This can result in feed refusal or diesease in the rabbits. Food supplies must be stored off the ground and in containers with tight fitting lids once opened. To be corrected by 7/7/17.

SANITATION.

Rabbit enclosure with brown rex and black lion/flop rabbits (2) had excessive amount of fecal material and spilled food built up in the bottom of the cage. Unsanitary conditions can lead to disease or infestation of pests. Cages must be cleaned as needed to prevent fecal and debris buildup. Correct by 7/7/17.

FACILITIES, GENERAL.

One large polyethylene woven collapsible bag (one ton soft tote) containing cracked corn was sitting on the ground

with top open and corn spilling out onto ground. In the shed containing the mother pig and two piglets, multiple bags of mini-pig feed and other feed bags were sitting on the ground. Improperly stored feed can become infested with pests or vermin or become wet and spoiled leading to reduced palatability and nutritional value. Animals can refuse to eat or become ill from eating contaminated or spoiled feed. All feed supplies must be stored off the ground and in a manner to prevent contamination and spoilage. To be corrected by 7/25/17.

WATERING.

The water tub for the pen of adult La Mancha goats was green and cloudy with a large number of flies and other insects floating on top. A large amount of green slime was present along sides and bottom of tub. Contaminated water can be unpalatable and unhealthy for the animals and serve as a breeding ground for insects. All water containers must be kept clean and sanitary. To be corrected by 7/7/17.

3.131(c)

SANITATION.

Large amounts of clutter and debris were present in the shed housing the mother pig and two piglets. This can provide a habitat for vermin to breed and hide and present safety hazards. Animal housing areas should be kept clear of trash and debris at all times. To be corrected by 8/4/17.
