3.130 Direct

Watering.

In an enclosure housing two otters, there were three pools filled with murky brown water, pieces of grass and dirt/sand sediment. The bottom of the pools could not be visualized. Per the licensee, there is no other receptacle dedicated to providing potable water.

In an enclosure housing a coatimundi, there was a water receptacle filled with the roots of dead weeds. The water was murky and the bottom of the receptacle could not be visualized. No other drinking receptacles were provided.

In an enclosure housing two skunks and a squirrel, the water receptacle for the skunks contained a minimal amount of murky brown water. Dirt/sand sedimentation and bits of soggy food could be seen in a layer at the bottom of the receptacle.

In an enclosure housing a tiger and black bear, a large metallic pool contained murky brown water. The bottom of the receptacle could not be visualized. Per the licensee, there is no other receptacle dedicated to providing potable water.

In an enclosure housing a Syrian bear, the water in the cement pool is a murky green color with a film of algae lining the interior sides. Per the licensee, there is no other receptacle dedicated to providing potable water.

All water receptacles shall be kept clean and sanitary. Failure to maintain the drinking water receptacles in clean and

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sanitary conditions could result in water quality that is harmful to animals.

3.125(a) Repeat

Facilities, general.

Several enclosures were observed to be in varying states of disrepair.

In the enclosure housing five servals, there was a wooden platform with a section of wood that has been worn away exposing a jagged hole. This section of the platform has the potential for limb entrapment.

In the enclosure housing two caracals, there was a worn (darkened, discolored, beginning to splinter) wooden platform with an exposed screw near the edge of the platform.

In the enclosure housing a tiger and black bear, there was a wooden 2X4 support plank extending over the top of the enclosure over the den with substantial damage (chunks of wood missing or splintered). Approximately 50% of the plank is still intact. Additionally, the top section of the primary den shows signs of wear (worn, discolored, splintered wood).

Wearing wood and poorly maintained structures within primary enclosures can cause injury to the animals if not regularly maintained. Outdoor housing facilities shall be structurally sound and shall be maintained in good repair to protect the animals from injury and contain the animals.

3.131(d) Sanitation.

The food prep shed has excessive flies in it. Additionally, there is excessive accumulation of spider webs, the food prep shed portals of entry do not close securely and the area is cluttered.

A safe and effective program for the control of pests shall be established and maintained. It shall be utilized to eliminate excessive flies in the food prep area to prevent contamination of food.

Environment enhancement to promote psychological well-being.

The current environmental enhancement program only addresses the psychological well-being for ringtail lemurs. The licensee now exhibits a bush baby, hybrid ruffed lemur and owl monkey. The licensee could not produce an EEP that addressed the species need for the additional nonhuman primates.

Exhibitors must develop, document and follow an appropriate plan for environment enhancement adequate to promote the psychological well-being of nonhuman primates. The plan must be in accordance with the currently accepted professional standards and as directed by the attending veterinarian.

2.75(b)(1)

Repeat

Records: Dealers and exhibitors.

A review of facility records identified an incomplete inventory of animals on hand. It did not list a newly acquired otter (whose acquisition paperwork was also missing), 3 pot belly pigs, two adolescent bear cubs, and 5 fennec fox kits.

Additionally, there were no records of disposition for several animals that had passed: raccoon, kinkajou, prevost squirrel, lynx, lion, cougar. Complete acquisition records are required for tracking animal ownership and for compliance with animal welfare regulations.

Correct by maintaining an updated record of animals on hand as well as maintaining records of acquisition or disposition for any animal exhibited at the facility.

2.40(a)

Attending veterinarian and adequate veterinary care (dealers and exhibitors).

The program of veterinary care has not been updated to include adequate veterinary care for the following species: 1 rabbit, 2 otters, 1 owl monkey.

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Exhibitors shall have an attending veterinarian who shall provide adequate veterinary care to its animals in compliance with the animal welfare regulations. The formal arrangements shall include a written program of veterinary care and regularly scheduled visits to the premises of the exhibitor.

Correct by November 20th, 2020.
